Policy: School Uniform-Sep 2017

Overview

The aim of the school is to have pupils dress with a school identity in a smart, affordable and practical way, which conforms to standards of decency and safety and enables all pupils to be seen and therefore treated equally. The school uniform shows that pupils belong to our school community and should be worn with pride. School Uniform is a requirement for being part of our school and is compulsory for all pupils.

The school expects all parents who accept a place at St Gilbert's RC Primary School to comply with compulsory school uniform standards. All items of school uniform must be clearly named.

PE Kit: Trainers must be provided. In winter months dark jogging pants, a dark jumper (without a logo) must also be provided to your child.

If correct P.E. kit is not brought a note to parents will be written in the reading diary and old kit will be given to wear. A phone call is made home from the office asking parents to bring the PE down to school.

Your child is expected to have their P.E. kit in school at all times and only taken home when necessary.

Shoes:

- No trainers or shoes that look like trainers
- No ballet pump type shoes or plimsolls
- No logos
- No flashing lights
- No sling backs or heels
- No ankle boots

School uniform with the logo can be purchased via the PSU website. Non-logo items can be purchased from most major high street stockists.

Jewellery and Hair

Children should not wear jewellery to school including stud earrings. If a child is having their ear pierced it must be done so in the summer holidays and taken out before their return to school. A small plain analogue wrist watch is allowed.

Children with long hair should wear it tied or clipped back for school. Hair accessories should be discreet and ideally in school colours. Children should not have their hair cut in any extreme styles, e.g. too short, (less than a number 2), patterned, or dyed, and it is at the discretion of the Headteacher to ask parents to change the haircut if it is thought inappropriate.

Make Up-No makeup, including nail varnish and coloured lip-balm, must be worn to school.

If the school uniform policy is continually disregarded then the parent will be asked to collect the child and return them to school correctly dressed.

OUTCOMES

Children will be happy and enjoy their time in school. The protection of children is the responsibility of everyone in school and so all will be vigilant in their duty of care of children. This school will be a place of safety where the welfare, care and protection of children is paramount so that it supports and encourages their growth and development both in and out of school. This policy should be read in conjunction with the Policy for Safeguarding and Protecting Children.
